## **Minutes for April 13, 2013 Meeting**

### **Mission by the Sea Church**

The APTA Board of Directors meeting was called to order by President Jim McCloy at 9 a.m.

Motion made by Allan Feifer to accept the Minutes for February 9, 2013; Paul Parker seconded; approved by the Board.

Motion made by Eddie Sosebee to accept the Treasurer's Report showing a total balance of \$43,100.32; motion seconded by Frank Gibson; approved by the Board.

### ***Committee Reports***

Bill Kimbrough reported that \$2,010.00 has been received for membership dues.

Jim McCloy reported to Bay North that their offer was accepted by the APTA Board, but Jim hasn't received a reply yet.

A Natal Grass Removal work project has been scheduled for Saturday, April 27 from 10 to noon. The Nature Conservancy will make available informational signs for homeowners who participate in the eradication effort.

Sam Rogers noted that the newsletter has been mailed; Jim McCloy thanked him for his efforts.

Paul Parker reported on the first RESTORE Council meeting, which was mostly administrative in nature. No funding is in place yet.

Mary Jeanne Lykes reported that the Little Free Library signs have been installed.

Ann Maruszak distributed Nomination Questionnaires to the Board asking for their suggestions for potential Board nominees.

### ***Old Business***

Jim McCloy reported that the MSBU ballots will be mailed April 25 to be opened on May 14. He will be sending a notice to his Bay North and St. Theresa contacts to urge them to vote "yes."

### ***New Business***

Marvin Heymann gave a presentation regarding his review of existing evacuation route, erosion control and beach renourishment studies.

Allan Feifer reported that the Alligator Point Water Department employees tasked with changing out a chlorine gas cylinder inadvertently caused some gas to escape endangering themselves, but not the community. A review of the incident revealed that there were no policies and procedures in place for the situation and this has been rectified.
